We can tell by the photos how many smiles and happy faces were seen at the events. Horizon staff and People Supported definitely know how to have fun and enjoy themselves.




Fixby Lodge have been busy over the last few months with various activities the PWS have been involved in.



The PWS have been to see the lights in Blackpool; visit Coronation Street's famous Rovers Return and staying more local by visiting Tong











Horizon moves into the digital age of Support Planning

As you may already be aware we are undergoing a very exciting development throughout all of the homes; the introduction of Digital Support Planning.

After some considerable research and consultation with colleagues in other organisations who use various digital systems, we are delighted to announce that we have chosen a great organisation called Nourish. The senior management team have all recently



completed the Train the Trainer programme so that they are ready to begin the implementation process.

Staff will be trained and start using Nourish, initially alongside our paper based records, over the coming weeks. This change comes as a part of our continuous drive to improve the quality of service delivery across all of our homes and ties in with our Business Development Plan. It also ties in with the Department for Health and Social Care's target of having 80% of Social Care providers using integrated digital platforms by March 2024

The benefits of digital support planning are:

- It will free up time for our employees to spend more time with the people we support
- It will make it quicker and easier for our employees to record the great care and support they provide
- It will reduce a lot of repetitive paperwork, allowing us to concentrate on the things that are important in delivering personalised care and support

It enables us to evidence the great support that is delivered everyday and ensures that we are credited with

this from external inspection bodies. It will bring a positive impact for our employees, the People We Support, their loved ones, our commissioners and other stakeholders.


If you visit any of the homes during the roll out of Nourish, you might notice some key changes to the way we are delivering support. Our employees will be using mobile devices to record the support they are giving, either by typing on or speaking into the device. They may even use the devices to take pictures when appropriate, to provide a richer account of a person's day.
