Patsy who works at Hampton and Mandi who is the manager at Fixby Lodge have been with Horizon for 10 years. Of course, we had parties for both!


Over the next year, we have employees who will be celebrating their 15th anniversaries - and in true Horizon style, parties are being planned already!
