The use of these mobile devices is effectively no different to what happened previously, other than it makes it much easier for us to be able to retrieve data to use as evidence in all types of reviews, for audits, and inspections. It continues to be our policy that the use of personal mobile phones whilst working directly with people supported is strictly not permitted.
