Learning and Development—Lets talk qualifications!

It's no secret that our staff are constantly developing their skills through ongoing training in a multitude of areas. In fact, in their first year alone, new starters have to complete the equivalent of 25 hours of eLearning, 34 hours of face to face training (sometimes more depending on clinical needs), in addition to 'on the job' training and regular competency assessments! But did you know that our staff also complete their professional health and social care qualifications? Following successful completion of their probationary period, all eligible staff are enrolled onto a Diploma relevant to their role. This is a huge investment and commitment, but one which further enhances the skills of our staff teams as well as enabling each staff member to achieve a nationally recognised qualification at no cost to themselves.

As things currently stand, we have 121 staff members already qualified and another 41 staff members undertaking their Diplomas. With more staff due to enrol, this is an ongoing commitment from Horizon Healthcare Homes. Rob Smith, Registered Manager at Cranmer Court who recently passed his Level 5 Diploma in Leadership commented "Completing my Level 5 qualification has been a significant milestone in my professional development, and joining Horizon played a crucial role in helping me achieve it. The supportive environment and structured approach at Horizon allowed me to fully focus on my studies, refine my skills, and apply my learning in meaningful ways. Thanks to this opportunity, I was able to complete the qualification with confidence and ultimately achieve a distinction in my end point assessment an outcome I'm incredibly proud of". Another of our recent achievers Adele Luciarrini from Sandhurst Court commented the following "Doing my level 2 has allowed me to learn many new things about the wonderful job we do day in day out to support the people we have, it's given me a real sense of achievement and there has been an extremely high level of support from both management and fellow colleagues throughout!" Adele also gained a distinction. Well done to both Rob, Adele and to everyone else who has been awarded or is currently working through their qualification - you should be very proud of your efforts and achievements!!!
